Since FMHRC is not responsible for and has no involvement in the appointment/removal process, the statutory amendment requires no action on the part of FMHRC through rulemaking.

<p>FMHRC did not complete a 2014-2015 Annual Regulatory Plan; however, in reviewing laws enacted during the 2013 and 2014 legislative session, FMHRC determined that no laws were enacted or amended that created or modified the duties of the authority of FMHRC. The only law enacted impacting FMHRC's operation was Ch. 2013-158, Laws of Florida, that amended F.S. 723.06115 by identifying a process FMHRC must follow when seeking distributions from the FMHRC Trust Fund from the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation.</p>	<p>No</p>	<p>No</p>	<p>n/a</p>	<p>n/a</p>	<p>The amendments to F.S. 723.06115 include a detailed process FMHRC must follow to obtain distributions from the FMHRC Trust Fund. 
